**【 Phrasal Verbs 】**

Phrasal verbs are usually two-word phrases consisting of :

**verb + adverb (e.g. go ahead )** or **verb + preposition (e.g. give up).**

The list below shows some common phrasal verbs with meanings and examples.

Phrasal verb	Meaning	Example
<b>*bring sth up</b>	to mention sth	She is creative. She always <b>brings up</b> some new ideas in the meeting.
<b>*care for sb/sth</b>	to protect sb/sth and provide what they need	She can't go out for work because she has to <b>care for</b> her elderly mother at home.
<b>clean sth up</b>	tidy, clean	Please <b>clean up</b> your bedroom before you go outside.
<b>*clean sth out</b>	to take everything out of a room, car, container, etc and clean the inside of it.	We'd better <b>clean out</b> the storeroom as our cousin is moving in next week.
<b>*fill sth in</b>	to write information in blanks	Please <b>fill in</b> the form with your name, address and phone number.
<b>*fill sth up</b>	fill to the top	I always <b>fill</b> the water jug <b>up</b> when it is empty.
<b>get on/off sth</b>	step onto/ out of a vehicle	Every day, I <b>get on</b> Bus 70 at 6:30a.m..
<b>*get up</b>	get out of bed	I <b>got up</b> early to study for my exam.
<b>*give sth away</b>	give sth to sb for free	The library <b>gave away</b> old books on Friday.
<b>*give up</b>	stop trying	This sum was too difficult so I <b>gave up</b> .
<b>*look after sb/sth</b>	take care of	I have to <b>look after</b> my sick mother.
<b>*look down on sb</b>	consider inferior	Paul is poor so they <b>look down on</b> him.
<b>look for sb/sth</b>	try to find	I'm <b>looking for</b> a red dress for the party.
<b>put sth away</b>	put sth in the place where it is usually kept	Let me <b>put</b> these files <b>away</b> first.
<b>put sth on</b>	put clothing/accessories on your body	Don't forget to <b>put on</b> your new earrings for the party.
<b>show up</b>	arrive	After a long wait, Tim finally <b>shows up</b> .
<b>*hand in</b>	return or submit	Please <b>hand in</b> your exam paper after the bell rings.
